2. Emergency School Closure Resolution:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of School District No. 2, Golden Valley County, Montana, will meet at 7:00 p.m. at Lavina Public School Lunch Room on March 12, 2019 for the purpose of an emergency school closure day.
